MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING JUNE 17, 2025

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, at the Atascocita Waste Water Treatment Plant, 5003 Atascocita Road, Humble, Texas 77346, on June 17, 2025, at 5:30 p.m.; whereupon the roll was called of the Board, to-wit:

Owen H. Parker, President Chris Green, Vice President Cheryl Moore, Secretary Robin Sulpizio, Assistant Secretary Dennis Bone, Assistant Secretary

All members of the Board were present. Also attending all or parts of the meeting were Lieutenant Steve Romero of Harris County Precinct 4 Constable's Office; Mr. Chris Davey of Ad Valorem Appraisals, tax assessor and collector for the District; Mr. Corey Burton of Municipal Accounts & Consulting, LP ("MAC"), bookkeeper for the District; Mr. Chris Meinhardt of BGE, Inc. ("BGE"), engineers for the District; Mr. Clint Gehrke of Water Waste Water Management Services, Inc. ("WWWMS"), operators for the District; and Mr. Dimitri Millas, Ms. Leslie Bacon and Ms. Jane Maher of Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP ("NRF"), attorneys for the District.

Call to Order. President Parker called the meeting to order in accordance with notice posted pursuant to law, copies of certificates of posting of which are attached hereto as *Exhibit A*, and the following business was transacted:

- 1. **Public Comments**. There were no public comments.
- 2. **Minutes**. The Board considered the proposed minutes of meeting held on May 20, 2025, previously distributed to the Board. Upon motion by Director Sulpizio, seconded by Director Bone, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the meetings held on May 20, 2025, as presented.
- 3. **Security Report**. President Parker recognized Lieutenant Romero, who reviewed the Security Report for the month of May 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit B*. Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Security Report.
- 4. Review Operations Report, authorize repairs, and approve termination of delinquent accounts in accordance with the District's Rate Order. President Parker recognized Mr. Gehrke, who presented the Operations Report dated June 17, 2025 and a list of delinquent accounts, copies of which are attached hereto as *Exhibit C.* Mr. Gehrke reported that 98.37% of the water pumped was billed for the period May 1, 2025 through May 31, 2025.
- Mr. Gehrke reported on various maintenance items. He reported on Lift Station No. 4. He requested approval to purchase and install a crane with winch to pull the pump. He stated that the cost of the crane/winch is \$4,037.95, the crane pedestal is \$599.95 and the stainless steel

Mr. Gehrke reported on the Consumer Confidence Report ("CCR").

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Operations Report, approve the termination of delinquent accounts in accordance with the terms of the District's Rate Order, approve the CCR and approve the purchase and installation of a crane with winch to pull the pump at Lift Station No. 4.

- 5. **Approve Consumer Confidence Report.** This item was addressed under the previous item.
- 6. **Tax Collector's Report and authorize payment of certain bills**. President Parker recognized Mr. Davey, who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Tax Assessor and Collector's Report for the month of May 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit D*.

Upon motion by Director Bone, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Tax Assessor and Collector's Report and to authorize payment of checks therein, from the Tax Account to the persons, in the amounts, and for the purposes listed therein.

7. Review Bookkeeper's Report, and authorize payment of certain bills, and approve quarterly investment report. President Parker recognized Mr. Burton, who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Bookkeeper's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit E*.

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Moore, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Bookkeeper's Report and to authorize payment of the checks in the amounts, to the persons, and for the purposes listed therein.

8. **Discuss and consider engagement of auditor for reconciliation of past billing and take any necessary action.** President Parker presented to and reviewed with the Board the engagement letter from McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot Ellis PLLC for the reconciliation of past billing for WWWMS's overbilling calculations of regional water authority fees, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit F*.

Upon motion by Director Bone, seconded by Director Green, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the engagement of McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot Ellis PLLC.

- 9. **Discuss administration and payment of contract benefiting other AJOB members.** President Parker recognized Ms. Bacon, who stated that there is no action. She noted that the notification letters were sent to the other AJOB districts.
- 10. **Engineer's Report**. President Parker recognized Mr. Meinhardt who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Engineer's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit G*.

- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Barents Drive Lift Station. He stated that the final inspection is scheduled for June 17, 2025.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Wastewater Treatment Plant. He stated that BGE anticipates 100% design plans (civil, structural, and electrical) to be completed by the end of late June/early July.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation. He stated that the survey CAD file is complete and that BGE anticipates design plans to be 10% complete by late June/early July.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Capital Improvement Plan. He stated that BGE is currently working on the 2025 adopted budget CIP projects.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on Lift Station No. 3 Rehabilitation/Fence Replacement. He stated that BGE anticipates 100% of the design plans to be completed by mid-June. He requested authorization to advertise and bid the project.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Interconnect with HCMUD No. 46. He reviewed the proposal and preliminary cost estimate for the project in the amount of \$83,000.00.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on Water Plant No. 1 Ground Storage Tank Replacement. He stated that the project is progressing well and that the walls are currently being erected. He presented Pay Estimate No. 2 in the amount of \$46,890.00 for approval.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on Water Plant No. 1 and No. 2 Electrical Improvements. He stated that BGE is currently working on a proposal and preliminary cost estimate and that BGE plans to schedule a site visit with WWWMS to verify the scope. He noted that BGE anticipates presenting the proposal/preliminary cost estimate at the July or August meeting.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Woodland Hills Tract. He stated that there is no update this month.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the GIS. He reviewed a proposal to update the District's GIS application in the amount of \$16,550.00.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Master Stormwater Quality Permit Renewal. He stated that the permit renewal was submitted to Harris County on May 21, 2025.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on Capacity Commitments. He stated that the owner of Champion's Volleyball of Houston, LLC ("Champion's") is requesting a locked water meter to be unlocked to serve the tract. He reviewed the agreement the District has with Champion's. He also reported that Champion's is requesting \$22,000.00 to be refunded for the work the District was supposed to do but was never done. He stated that BGE is working with NRF and MAC to resolve the issue.

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to: (1) approve the Engineer's Report; (2) authorize BGE to advertise and bid the Lift Station No. 3 Rehabilitation/Fence Replacement project; (3) approve the proposal for the Interconnect with HCMUD No. 46 in the amount of \$83,000.00; (4) approve Pay Estimate No. 2 in the amount of \$46,890.00 for Water

Plant No. 1 Ground Storage Tank Replacement; (5) defer action on the Capacity Commitment for Champion's; and (6) approve the proposal to update the District's GIS application in the amount of \$16,550.00.

11. **Discuss HGSD Water Conservation Grant Program.** President Parker reviewed the email received from Harris-Galveston Subsidence District ("HGSD") regarding the Water Conservation Grant Program, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit H*. Mr. Meinhardt stated that he would look into the program.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD, the meeting was adjourned.

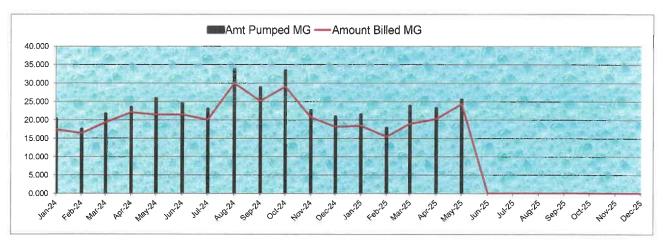

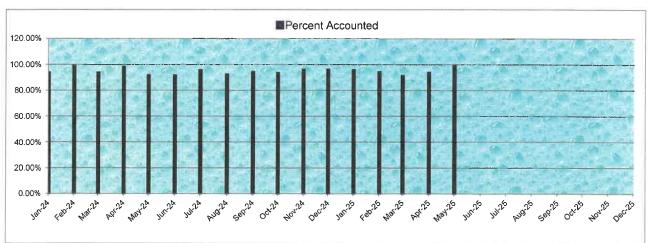

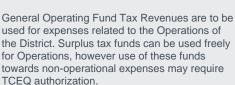

The majority of Special Purpose Districts levy at least two different tax rates: Maintenance & Operations and Debt Service. Other tax rates may include Road, Park, Fire, Contract Debt and Contract Maintenance taxes. Many people wonder what these revenues can be used for, if there are restrictions on them, and if so, what are they?



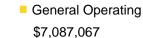






Debt Service Tax Revenues are restricted and can only be used to pay down the Principal and Interest of the District Bonds, or to pay the Districts share of other debt through Debt Contract Taxes. Districts are required to have enough funds to cover yearly payments plus a quarter of next year s requirements. As the outstanding debt obligation decreases, so can the Debt Service tax rate needed to generate those collections.

Account Balance | As of 06/17/2025

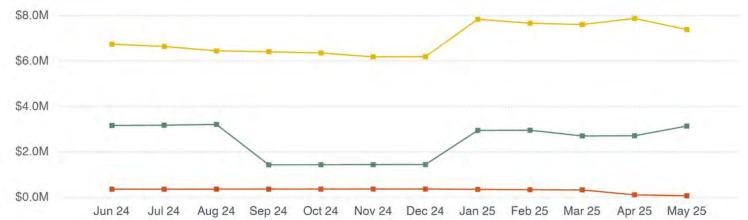

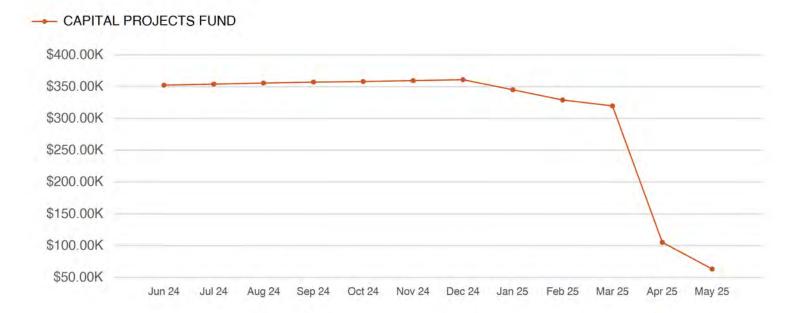

Investment Profile as of 06/17/2025



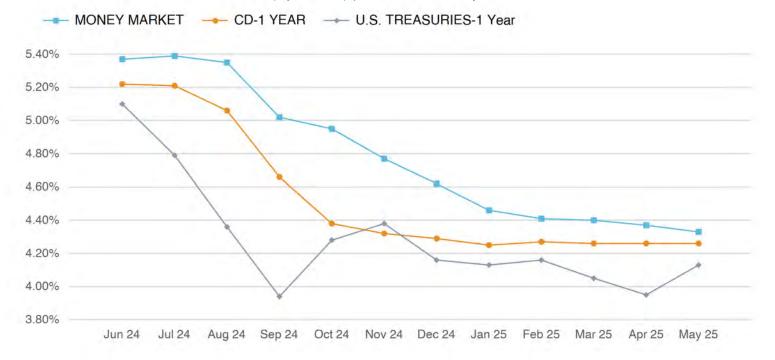

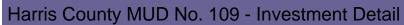

We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the terms of our engagement and the nature and limitations of the services we are to provide for Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109 (the "District").

We will apply the agreed-upon procedures enumerated below that were specified and agreed to by the Board of Directors of the District, on the calculations submitted by the District's operator for the amount to be reimbursed to District customers as a result of the overbilling of regional water authority fees. Our engagement to apply agreed-upon procedures will be conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Those standards require that we obtain your written agreement to the procedures to be applied and your acknowledgement that those procedures are appropriate for the intended purpose of the engagement, as described in this letter. The agreement and acknowledgment are contained with this letter. A refusal to provide such agreement and acknowledgment will result in our withdrawal from the engagement. We make no representation that the procedures we will perform are appropriate for the intended purpose of the engagement or for any other purpose. The procedures we will perform are as summarized below:

- A. We will inspect the schedules, calculations and billings from the District's operator detailing the customers' overbilling of regional water authority fees.
- B. We will test the operator's calculations for accuracy.
- C. We will review the procedures which the operator has implemented to determine the likelihood that billing issues may occur in the future.

The objective of this agreed-upon procedures engagement will be to assist you in evaluating the accuracy and completeness of the overbilling calculations as well as the effectiveness of the procedures which have been implemented. Because the above agreed-upon procedures do not constitute an examination or review, we will not express an opinion or conclusion on the aforementioned reimbursable costs. In addition, we have no obligation to perform any procedures beyond those listed above.

Board of Directors Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109

We will issue a written report upon completion of our engagement that lists the procedures performed and our findings. Our report will be addressed to the Board of Directors of the District. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete any of the procedures, we will describe in our report any restrictions on the performance of the procedures, or not issue a report and withdraw from this engagement. You understand that the report is intended for the information and use of the Board of Directors of the District in compliance with certain rules of the Commission and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. We are aware that the report is subject to distribution under provisions of the Texas Public Information Act. Our report will contain a paragraph indicating that had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

An agreed-upon procedures engagement is not designed to detect instances of fraud or noncompliance with laws or regulations; however, we will communicate to you any known and suspected fraud and noncompliance with laws or regulations affecting the costs that come to our attention. In addition, if, in connection with this engagement, matters come to our attention that contradict the costs, we will disclose those matters in our report.

As the engaging party, the Board of Directors agrees to the procedures performed and acknowledges that they are appropriate to meet the intended purposes of this engagement as acknowledged by signature below. The Board of Directors are responsible for providing us with or causing to be provided (1) access to all information of which you are aware that is relevant to the performance of the agreed-upon procedures, (2) additional information that we may request for the purpose of performing the agreed-upon procedures, and (3) unrestricted access to persons and District consultants from whom we determine it necessary to obtain evidence relating to performing those procedures.

At the conclusion of our engagement, we will require certain written representations in the form of a representation letter from you. Noel Barfoot is the engagement partner and is responsible for supervising the engagement and signing the report or authorizing another individual to sign it. A final billing will be issued when the final report is released. We estimate the cost of performing these procedures on your behalf will not exceed \$5,000.

Anti-Boycott and Anti-Terrorism Verification. By signing and entering into the Agreement, McCall Gibson Swedlund Barfoot Ellis PLLC ("MGSBE") verifies, pursuant to Chapter 2271 of the Government Code, it does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of the Agreement. As used in the foregoing verification, "discriminate against a firearm entity or trade association" shall have the meaning assigned to such term in Section 2274.001(3), Texas Government Code, as amended.

You agree that any dispute regarding this engagement will, prior to resorting to litigation, be submitted to mediation upon written request by either party. Both parties agree to try in good faith to settle the dispute in mediation. The American Arbitration Association will administer any such mediation in accordance with its Commercial Mediation Rules. The results of the mediation proceeding shall be binding only if each of us agrees to be bound. We will share any costs of mediation proceedings equally.

Attribute information will be inputted for each new utility line and asset added. The information inputted for each asset will be based on the template for the Client's existing utilities.

This will allow a user to click on a subdivision boundary within the GIS web application to pull up and download the latest set of construction plan set for that entire section. This allows quick access to construction documents through the GIS interface.

Integrate Construction Plan Sheets with GIS Utility Lines

To improve document accessibility, BGE will extract and index individual plan sheets from construction plan sets and attach them to their corresponding utility lines (Water, Sanitary, and Storm) within the GIS application.

Each utility line feature will include a link in its popup window to view the relevant sheet. The sheet will only show the relevant pages for the line selected and get you right to the information one needs to view. This structured approach ensures quick access to detailed design plans and reduces time searching for files.

Deliverables

The BGE Web Map solution containing the data mentioned above will be accessed through the internet with compatible smartphones, tablets, and PCs. BGE will continue to host the solution and provide a named account login and credentials. The solution will be delivered within 2 months of the execution of the contract. The client retains ownership of the data that is collected as part of the project including the pictures. The data can be exported and delivered to the client at any time. AGREEMENT FOR CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY

This Agreement for Conveyance of Property (this "Agreement"), dated as of August 18 ____, 2020, is entered into by and among Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109, a conservation and reclamation district created pursuant to Art. XVI, § 59 of the Texas Constitution and operating pursuant to Chapters 49 and 54 of the Texas Water Code, as amended (the "District"), having an address of 1301 McKinney, Suite 5100, Houston, Texas, 77010 and Ms. Sharice Gilbert, a resident within the District (the "Grantor"), having an address 8310 Shoregrove Drive, Humble, TX 77346.

WHEREAS, the District wishes to acquire certain real property (the "Tract") for the construction and use of wastewater lift station (the "Barents Drive Lift Station"); and

WHEREAS, the Grantor hereby conveys the Tract to the District, and the District hereby accepts the grant of such Tract pursuant to its powers under Section 49.218 of the Texas Water Code, as evidenced by a General Warranty Deed, attached hereto as *Exhibit A*; and

WHEREAS, in consideration for the conveyance of the Tract for the Barents Lift Station without cost to the District, the District hereby agrees to waive the customary Tap and Inspection and Installation Fees (the "Tap Fees") imposed pursuant to the District's Order Amending Consolidated Rate Order, approved and effective as of September 17, 2019, as may be amended from time to time, (the "Rate Order") for the parcel of land (the "Parcel") owned by the Grantor described in the metes and bounds attached hereto as *Exhibit B*; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the District and the Grantor agree as follows:

- 1. Consideration for Conveyance of Property. The District hereby agrees to waive the Tap Fees ordinarily imposed pursuant to Section 1(C) of the District's Rate Order upon the conveyance of the the Parcel owned by Grantor to the District. The District's agreement to waive such Tap Fees does not act to waive any such other fees imposed under the District's Rate Order, and the Rate Order otherwise remains in full effect for the Parcel.
- Address and Notices. All notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement from one party to the other shall be given in writing and shall be served by depositing the notice in the United States mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the party to be notified, with return receipt requested, or by hand delivery of the notice, or by email. The parties have the right from time to time and at any time to change their respective addresses and emails, and each shall have the right to specify such change by providing at least 15 days written notice to the other parties.
- 3. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the District and the Grantor concerning the conveyance of property to the District for the Barents Lift Station. There have been and are no agreements, covenants, representations, or warranties between the parties other than those expressly stated

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- or provided for herein. No modification hereof or subsequent agreement relative to the subject matter hereof shall be binding on any party unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties.
- 4. <u>Parties in Interest</u>. This Agreement shall be for the sole exclusive benefit of the District and the Grantor and shall not be construed to confer any benefit or right upon any other party, including particularly any resident of the District or the Grantor.
- 5. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. This Agreement shall apply to and be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective officers, directors, successors, and assigns. This Agreement and any of the rights obtained hereunder are not assignable by any party hereto without the express written consent of the other parties, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 6. <u>Authorization</u>. Each party represents that (i) execution and delivery of this Agreement by it has been duly authorized by its governing body or other persons from whom such party is legally bound to obtain authorization; (ii) that the consummation of the contemplated transactions will not result in a breach or violation of, or a default under, any agreement by which it or any of its properties is bound, or by any statute, rule, regulation, order, or other law to which it is subject; and (iii) this Agreement is a binding and enforceable agreement on its part.
- 7. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas.

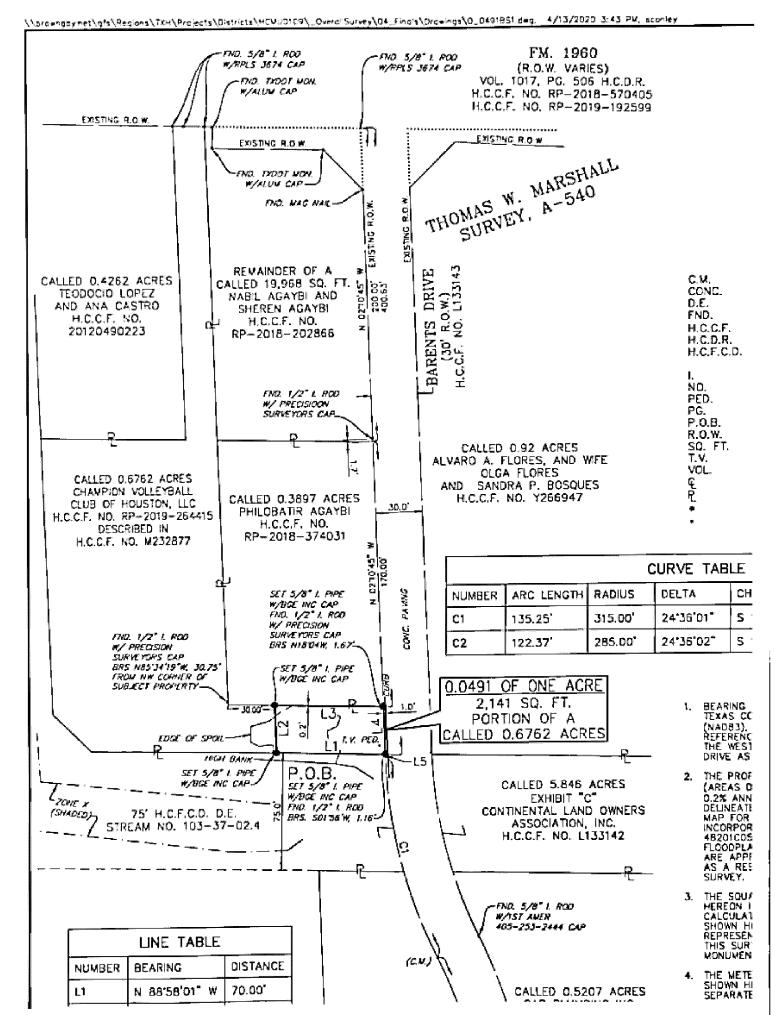
