The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, at the Atascocita Waste Water Treatment Plant, 5003 Atascocita Road, Humble, Texas 77346, on October 21, 2025, at 5:30 p.m.; whereupon the roll was called of the Board, to-wit:

Owen H. Parker, President Chris Green, Vice President Cheryl Moore, Secretary Robin Sulpizio, Assistant Secretary Dennis Bone, Assistant Secretary

All members of the Board were present, except Director Bone, thus constituting a quorum. Also attending all or parts of the meeting were Ms. Brenda McLaughlin and Ms. Odett Newman of Bob Leared Interests ("BLI"), tax assessor and collector for the District; Sergeant J. Boepple, Lieutenant Steve Romero, Captain B. Gheen and Deputy E. Krieg of Harris County Precinct 4 Constable's Office; Mr. Corey Burton of Municipal Accounts & Consulting, LP ("MAC"), bookkeeper for the District; Mr. Chris Meinhardt of BGE, Inc. ("BGE"), engineer for the District; Mr. Clint Gehrke of Water Waste Water Management Services, Inc. ("WWWMS"), operator for the District; and Mr. Dimitri Millas, Ms. Leslie Bacon and Ms. Jane Maher of Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP ("NRF"), attorneys for the District.

Call to Order. President Parker called the meeting to order in accordance with notice posted pursuant to law, copies of certificates of posting of which are attached hereto as *Exhibit A*, and the following business was transacted:

- 1. **Public Comments**. There were no public comments.
- 2. **Minutes**. The Board considered the proposed minutes of the meeting held on September 16, 2025, previously distributed to the Board. Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the meetings held on September 16, 2025, as presented.
- 3. **Security Report**. President Parker recognized Lieutenant Romero, who reviewed the Security Report for the month of September 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit B*. Discussion ensued.
- 4. **Public Hearing on 2025 Tax Rate.** President Parker opened the hearing on the proposed tax rate. There were no comments. President Parker closed the hearing.
- 5. **Adopt Order Setting Tax Rate and Levying Tax for 2025.** The Board reviewed an Order Setting Tax Rate and Levying Tax for 2025 (the "Order"), a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit C*. President Parker proposed that the Board consider adopting a tax rate of \$0.435 per \$100 assessed valuation. Discussion ensued.

Upon motion by Director Moore, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Order, thereby levying a tax rate of \$0.435 per \$100 assessed valuation (\$0.20 for debt service and \$0.235 for operations and maintenance).

- 6. **Approve Amended District Information Form.** President Parker recognized Ms. Bacon, who stated that since the tax rate remained the same from the previous year, filing an Amended District Information Form isn't needed.
- 7. **Approve and authorize filing of Continuing Disclosure Report.** President Parker recognized Ms. Bacon, who stated that the District is required to annually file updated financial information with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board 180 days after its fiscal year end, which includes the District's final audit in addition to certain tax and operating information gathered from District consultants. She reviewed the Annual Continuing Disclosure Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit D*.

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board the Board voted unanimously to authorize NRF to file the District's Annual Report of Financial Information and Operating Data for the fiscal year ended May 31, 2025.

- 8. Review Operations Report, authorize repairs, and approve termination of delinquent accounts in accordance with the District's Rate Order. President Parker recognized Mr. Gehrke, who presented the Operations Report dated October 21, 2025 and a list of delinquent accounts, copies of which are attached hereto as *Exhibit E.* Mr. Gehrke reported that 96.18% of the water pumped was billed for the period September 1, 2025 through September 31, 2025.
 - Mr. Gehrke reported on various maintenance items.
- Mr. Gehrke reviewed a customer request 5303 Dove Forest Ln. He stated that the customer had a toilet leak and is requesting a payment plan for the \$2,036.17 owed. He suggested a downpayment of \$500 and a six month payment plan for the remainder. He also reviewed a customer request for 20130 Misty Pines Dr. He stated that the customer is requesting waiving of the tampering fee and meter pull.
- Mr. Gehrke reviewed a quote for the clean-up of the manhole at 5311 Green Timbers Dr. in the amount of \$988.50. He stated that the customer informed WWWMS that a family member was dumping trash inside the manhole. Discussion ensued. Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to authorize NRF to send a letter to the resident and authorize WWWMS to back charge the \$988.50 to the customer.

Upon motion by Director Moore, seconded by Director Green, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Operations Report, approve the termination of delinquent accounts in accordance with the terms of the District's Rate Order, approve the payment plan for 5303 Dove Forest Ln and to deny the request for 20130 Misty Pines Dr.

9. **Tax Collector's Report and authorize payment of certain bills**. President Parker recognized Ms. McLaughlin and Ms. Newman, who provided an update on the transition. Ms. McLaughlin informed the Board that she has not been able to reach the previous tax assessor and BLI has not received any records from the previous tax assessor. President Parker stated that he would try to reach the previous tax assessor. Ms. Mclaughlin discussed the tax statements and noted that BLI currently does not have the delinquency information.

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to grant authority to President Parker to make a decision regarding getting the tax statements out without the delinquent statements.

The Board reviewed the Tax Assessor and Collector's Report from the previous tax assessor, a cop of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit F*. Ms. Maher noted that the report does not list any checks for approval.

- 10. Review Bookkeeper's Report, and authorize payment of certain bills, and approve quarterly investment report. President Parker recognized Mr. Burton, who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Bookkeeper's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit G*.
- Mr. Burton presented the District Snapshot Report provided by EVO, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit H*.

Upon motion by Director Moore, seconded by Director Sulpizio, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Bookkeeper's Report and to authorize payment of the checks in the amounts, to the persons, and for the purposes listed therein.

- 11. **Engineer's Report**. President Parker recognized Mr. Meinhardt who presented to and reviewed with the Board the Engineer's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit*
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Wastewater Treatment Plant Belt Press Replacement/Belt Press Building Rehabilitation. He stated that the preconstruction meeting was held on September 23, 2025 and that the Notice to Proceed was issued on October 6, 2025. He noted that submittal reviews are ongoing.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation. He stated that BGE is currently working on the plan set and that BGE anticipates the design plants to be 70% complete by the end of November.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Capital Improvement Plan. He stated that BGE is currently working on the 2025 adopted budget CIP projects.
- Mr. Meinhardt reported on Lift Station No. 3 Rehabilitation/Fence Replacement. He stated that the Notice to Proceed was issued for August 25, 2025, and that the submittal reviews are ongoing. He noted that the contractor plans to mobilize at the end of November due to waiting on supplies to be delivered.
 - Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Interconnect with Harris County Municipal Utility District No.

46 ("HCMUD No. 46"). He stated that the survey was completed last week and that the survey CAD file is being produced this week. He stated that BGE is planning on working towards 10% design plans once survey CAD file is complete.

Mr. Meinhardt reported on Water Plant No. 1 Ground Storage Tank Replacement. He stated that the exterior tank coating is ongoing. He reported that per the contractor, the resident at 19410 Forest Timbers Court has been taken care of. He noted that the contractor reports two other residents reporting overspray on the vehicles, which they plan to address. He presented Pay Estimate No. 6 in the amount of \$52,704.00 for approval.

Mr. Meinhardt reported on Water Plant No. 1 and No. 2 Electrical Improvements. He stated that BGE anticipates 30% design plans by the end of October.

Mr. Meinhardt reported on the Woodland Hills Tract. He stated that there is no update this month.

Mr. Meinhardt reported on the GIS. He stated that the GIS update for the District is complete. He reported that all utilities from 2018-present have been added and that the utility feature is no linked to record drawings.

Mr. Meinhardt reported on Capacity Commitments. He stated that he has been in contact with Mr. Gilbert and is waiting for documentation from Mr. Gilbert showing what was paid to the District for the utility extension across FM 1960.

Upon motion by Director Green, seconded by Director Moore, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to: (1) approve the Engineer's Report; (2) and approve Pay Estimate No. 6 in the amount of \$52,704.00 for the Water Plant No. 1 Ground Storage Tank Replacement.

12. Consider approval of AWBD bylaw amendments and authorize designated member representative to vote on behalf of District. President Parker recognized Mr. Millas, who presented to and reviewed with the Board a summary of the proposed bylaw amendments of the Association of Water Board Directors ("AWBD"), a copy of which is attached hereto as *Exhibit J*. He stated that the Board can nominate and authorize a designated Board member to vote on behalf of the District.

Upon motion by Director Sulpizio, seconded by Director Green, after full discussion and the question being put to the Board, the Board voted unanimously to nominate and authorize President Parker as the representative to vote on behalf of the District.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE BOARD, the meeting was adjourned.

ORDER SETTING TAX RATE AND LEVYING TAX FOR 2025

WHEREAS, the Appraisal Review Board of the Harris County Appraisal District (the "HCAD") has finally approved the appraisal records of Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 109 (the "District") and the chief appraiser of the HCAD has prepared and certified to the District's tax assessor and collector the District's tax roll for 2025;

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the District is required to levy and cause to be assessed and collected ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property within the District in sufficient amount to pay the interest on bonds issued by the District payable in whole or in part from taxes, to create a sinking fund for the payment of the principal of the bonds when due or the redemption price at any earlier required redemption date, to pay when due the other contractual obligations of the District payable in whole or in part from taxes, and to pay the expenses of assessing and collecting the taxes, full allowance being made for expected delinquencies;

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized to levy and collect a tax for operation and maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, all actions required to be taken prior to levying such tax have been taken;

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTIITY DISTRICT NO. 109 THAT:

I.

The Board hereby levies and causes to be assessed upon all taxable property within the District an ad valorem tax for the year 2025 at the rate of \$[0.] per \$100 assessed valuation to pay the debt service requirements on District bonds (TAX LEVY FOR BONDS); at the rate of \$[0.] per \$100 assessed valuation for operation and maintenance purposes (MAINTENANCE TAX). TOTAL TAX RATE = \$[0.] per \$100 assessed valuation. Such total tax rate shall consist of:

\$[0._] per \$100 assessed valuation, which shall, pursuant to the Texas Property Tax Code, comprise the District's Debt Tax and shall be the rate that will impose the amount of taxes needed to pay the District's debt service; and

\$[0._] per \$100 assessed valuation, which shall, pursuant to the Texas Property Tax Code, comprise the District's Operation and Maintenance Tax and shall be the rate that will impose the amount of taxes needed to fund maintenance and operation expenditures of the District for the next year.

II.

Taxes shall be due and payable on receipt of the tax bill and shall be paid on or before January 31, 2026 or as otherwise provided by section 31.02 of the Texas Property Tax Code.

The Tax Assessor and Collector for the District is hereby authorized and instructed to proceed to collect the aforesaid tax upon the basis of this Order.

IV.

Pursuant to Section 49.455 of the Texas Water Code, the District has filed an Amended Information Form indicating the most recent rate of District taxes on property located in the District. If such rate is changed by this Order, the District shall file within seven days an amendment to such Information Form indicating that the most recent rate of District taxes on property located in the District is \$[0._] per \$100 assessed valuation.

V.

The President or the Vice President and Secretary or Assistant Secretary are authorized on behalf of the Board to evidence adoption of this Order and to do any and all things appropriate or necessary to give effect to the intent hereof.

THE SYSTEM

Water

The District is served with potable water by two groundwater supply plants. According to the engineer for the District, the total capacity is sufficient to serve 6,667 equivalent single-family connections. The Historical Operations of the System are included in the audited financial statements of the District attached hereto.

Wastewater

Permanent wastewater treatment for Atascocita (Harris County MUD Nos. 46, 106, 132, 151, 152, 153, and 494) and the District is being provided by a regional sewage treatment plant (the "Regional Plant"). The Regional Plant has a total capacity of nine million gallons per day ("gpd"), of which the District owns 2.10 million gpd capacity. According to the engineer, this capacity is sufficient to serve approximately 6,285 equivalent single-family connections within the District.

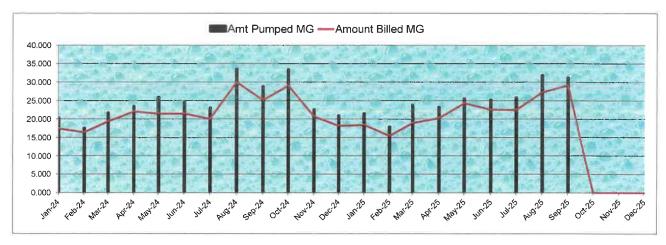

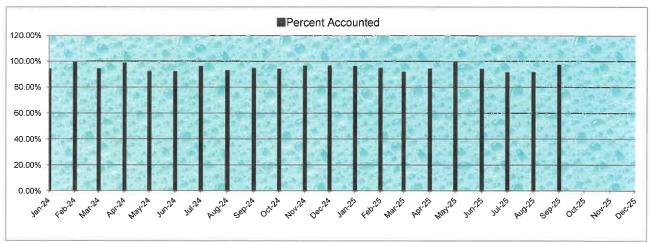

NOTICE OF TAXPAYERS' RIGHT TO ROLLBACK ELECTION

If taxes on the average residence homestead increase by more than eight percent, the qualified voters of the district by petition may require that an election be held to determine whether to reduce the operation and maintenance tax rate to the rollback tax rate under Section 49.236(d), Water Code.

If the district adopts a combined debt service, operation and maintenance and contract tax rate that would result in the taxes on the average residence homestead increasing by more than eight percent, an election must be held to determine whether to approve the operations and maintenance tax rate under Section 49.23601, Water Code. An election is not required if the adopted tax rate is less than or equal to the voter approved tax rate.

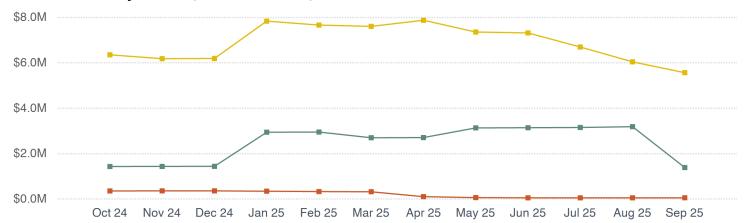

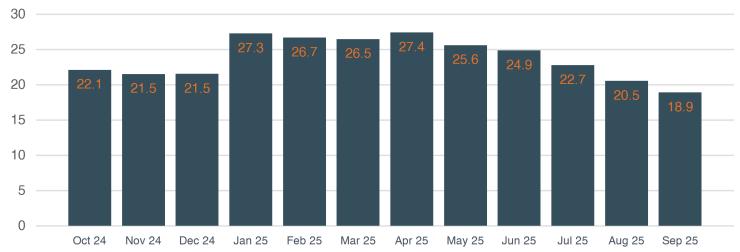

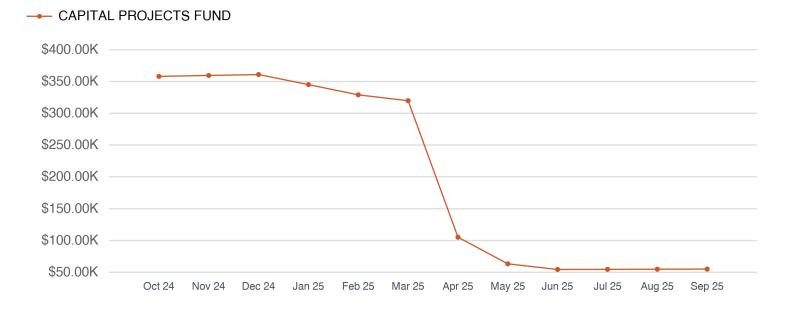

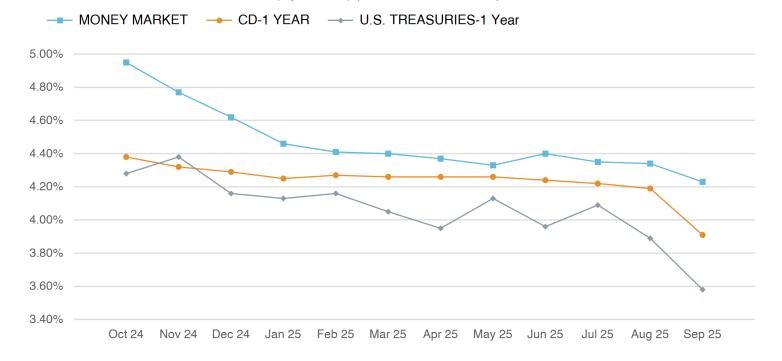

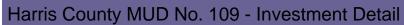

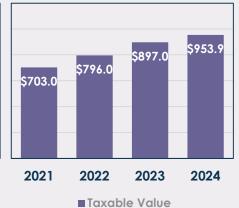

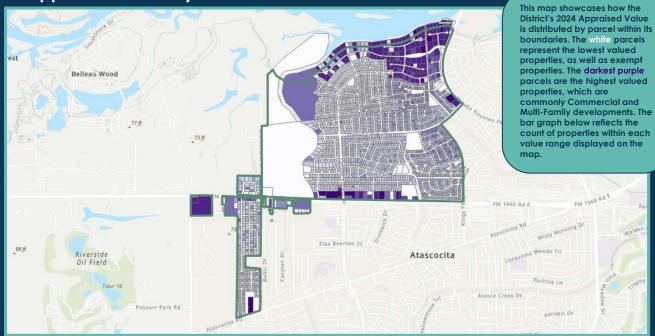


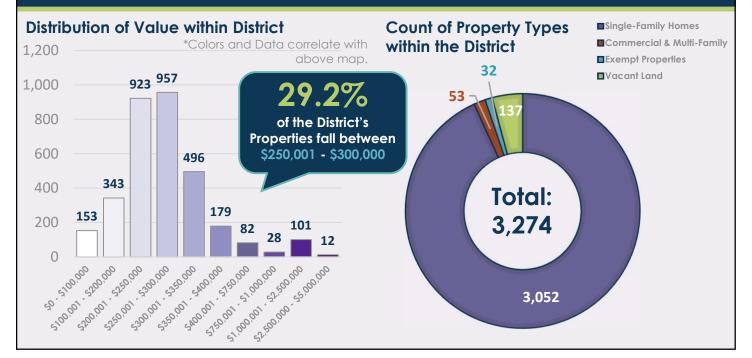
2024 Appraised Value by Parcel

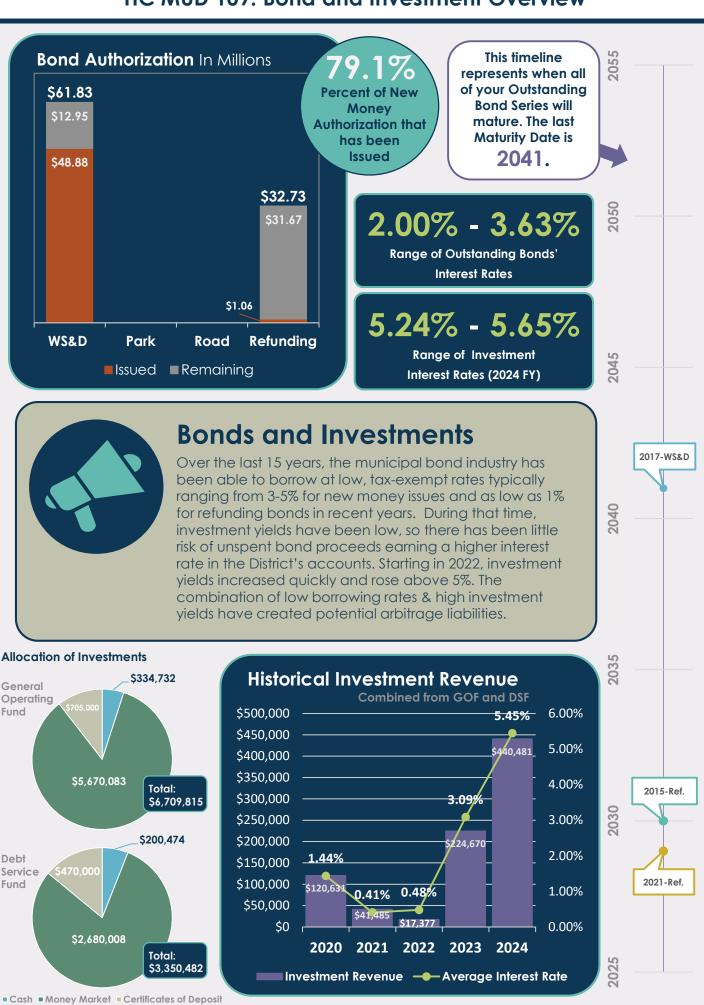

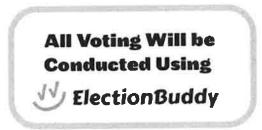
AWBD Members will have the opportunity to vote on very important proposed AWBD Bylaws clarifications and updates

WHAT IS ON THE BALLOT? Clarifications to four (4) existing Bylaws that deal with running for the AWBD Board of Trustees and the process necessary to amend the AWBD Bylaws.

WHY ARE THEY ON THE BALLOT? Simply to clear up the language regarding AWBD Board of Trustees qualifications, terms, and requirements, along with language regarding the passage of Bylaws amendments.

WHEN WILL VOTING OCCUR? Voting opens Monday, October 27, 2025, goes through the 2026 AWBD Midwinter Conference, and ends on Tuesday, January 27, 2026.

HOW DOES VOTING WORK? All voting will be done by the designated <u>voting Member Representative</u> for the Member, using Election Buddy, just like voting for the AWBD Board of Trustees.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED BYLAWS AMENDMENTS

Proposed Amendment

ARTICLE V. ORGANIZATION AND POWERS

- A. Board of Trustees and Qualifications
 - 1. The governing body of the Association shall be known as the Board of Trustees. It shall consist of the following officers: President, Executive Vice-President, First Vice President, Second Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, a representative of the Advisory Council, Immediate Past President and one Trustee from each of the geographic regions described below. Regional Trustees will be elected by the Members of their respective region. Regional Trustees may not serve as officers of the Board. The representative of the Advisory Council will be elected by the members of the Advisory Council. To be qualified to serve as a Trustee, each candidate shall have served as a Member Representative for one (1) or more Member(s) for at least two (2) of the last three (3) years prior to nomination; and currently be serving as a Member Representative for a Member whose dues are paid current. have been an active Member Representative of a Member(s) who has been a Member of the Association for at least two (2) years within the last three (3) years prior to nomination for such position and whose dues are paid current.

ARTICLE V. ORGANIZATION AND POWERS

- B. Terms, Qualifications, Powers and Restrictions of Officers
 - 9. Once elected, any Trustee will be permitted to complete his or her term in office, except as provided in Article VI A.1. hereof, even if continuing to serve results in the Trustee serving longer than six (6) consecutive years.
 - 10. A Member Representative may serve as a Trustee for up to six (6) consecutive years and then may seek re-election only after an Annual Meeting at which the Member Rep representative does not appear on the ballot. A Trustee who resigns, is removed from office, or serves six (6) consecutive years as Trustee may not be reappointed to the Board until after the expiration of at least twelve (12) months.

Explanation

The current Bylaws' requirements are confusing with respect to the length of time someone must be a Member Representative prior to running for the Board of Trustees. This revision is intended to simplify and clarify candidate eligibility requirements to allow someone who has been a Member Representative for two of the last three years and who is currently a Member Representative to run for the Board.

Note: A Member Representative is an elected or appointed representative of an entity that is an AWBD Member. For Example, a district is a Member and a director is a Member Representative for the district.

Section V.B.10 states that a Member Representative may serve as a Trustee for up to six (6) consecutive years, which is three (3) consecutive two (2) year terms, except as provided in Article VI.A.1 (regarding removal from office). If a Trustee is appointed to fill a vacancy and wins election three (3) times, the Bylaws do not address whether that person can serve the entire third (3rd) term. This revision clarifies that a Trustee may continue to serve even if such service results in the Trustee serving for more than six (6) consecutive years.

Proposed Amendment

ARTICLE V. ORGANIZATION AND POWERS

D. Creation of Regions

The Association may, if so determined by the Board, and subject to any restrictions or limitations in these Bylaws, create no fewer than three (3) and no more than five (5) geographic regions. Each region created by the Board shall be entitled to elect a Regional Trustee to serve on the Board. Regional Trustees must meet the qualifications to serve as a Trustee set forth in Article V A.1. at the time of election. In addition, each candidate for Regional Trustee must reside within the region they seek to represent at the time of their nomination. See the attached map for the regions of the Association.

ARTICLE XIV. AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

Proposals to amend these Bylaws must be made by written petition of at least twenty percent (20%) of the Members in good standing, as certified by the office of the Executive Director, or by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Board of Trustees of the Association. The Association membership shall be notified of the proposed amendments to the Bylaws not less than ten (10) calendar days prior to athe duly called meeting of the membership. The Board must call a meeting of the membership to consider such amendments within six (6) months after receipt of such proposal or at the next duly called meeting of the Association's membership, whichever comes first. Voting may shall be open for not less than two (2) consecutive weeks, which shall include either the annual or mid-winter conference and shall be conducted electronically or by paper ballot at the discretion of the Board to the extent that the method of voting complies with the other requirements of these Bylaws. Each Member of the Association, whose dues are paid current, is entitled to one (1) vote. Absentee ballots will be available from the office of the Executive Director and must be received by the Executive Director no later than seven (7) business days prior to the duly called meeting. Passage of an amendment to these Bylaws will require an affirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Members voting in such election, provided that fifty percent (50%) of such members in good standing shall have voted, and shall be effective immediately.

Explanation

Traditionally, Regional Trustees have resided in the region they represent, but the Bylaws have not required it. This revision merely requires that candidates for Regional Trustee reside in the region they seek to represent.

Currently, amending AWBD's Bylaws requires that any amendment be approved by an affirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Members with at least one-half (1/2) of all Members having voted in such election. In the past, proposed amendments have failed despite overwhelming support among voting Members because fewer than one-half (1/2) of the Members voted.

This revision removes the requirement that at least one-half (1/2) of the Members must vote on Bylaws amendments and adds a requirement that the period for voting must be open for at least two (2) weeks and include either the annual or mid-winter conference. In addition, the absentee ballot process is deleted because online voting allows Members to vote remotely.
